🔍 Construct a few typical phrases using **чем... тем...** and **всё**

1. "The further, the better" (i.e. things keep getting better and better)

2. The less grammar (грамматика), the better.

3. We're speaking Russian better and better.

🔍 Use superlative adjectives to say that these things are the "-est" in these places — for example, the "biggest museum in the city."

1. Мариинский — **красивый + театр + Петербург**.

2. Этот стол — **хороший + (стол - understood, no need to repeat!) + ресторан**.

🔍 Use more superlatives in some cases other than the genitive. Be sure to decline both **самый** and the adjective following it!

1. I bought the sweetest (милый) cat in the world (на свете).

2. We drank (use imperfective - we're focused on the activity itself) the most expensive wine in the restaurant.

🔍 Use more superlatives in **один из...** constructions with the genitive plural, as in "one of the smallest rooms"

1. I live in one of the worst rooms in the dorm.

2. Russian is one of the hardest languages in the world.
