

## 1. Forming imperatives

Give appropriate imperative form (**вы** versus **ты**) for these situations (you can give the **imperative form only**, including **не** if necessary).

1. **чувствовать себя** ОВА (to feel) → Feel yourself at home (как дома)! (to 1 guest) \_\_\_\_\_
2. **забывать** АЙ (to forget) → Passengers, don't forget your things (вещи)! \_\_\_\_\_
3. **угощаться** И (to help oneself) → Help yourself! (to several grandkids) \_\_\_\_\_
4. **вставать** АВАЙ (to get up) → Get up! (to one kid) \_\_\_\_\_
5. **смечь** ЕЙ (to dare) → Don't you dare! (to multiple people) \_\_\_\_\_
6. **закрывать** ОЙ (to close) → Close the window! (to a spouse) \_\_\_\_\_
7. **разбить** Ъ (to break) → Don't break the dish! (to rowdy children) \_\_\_\_\_
8. **смеяться** ЖА (to laugh) → Don't laugh at me! (to one cruel friend) \_\_\_\_\_
9. **оставаться** АВАЙ (to stay) → Stay here with us! (to one friend) \_\_\_\_\_
10. **опаздывать** АЙ (to be late) → Don't be late! (to colleagues) \_\_\_\_\_

Give the **ты** imperatives below; they will all end in either **-и** or **-ь**, so watching the **stress** pattern is key!
