REMEMBER: with **prefixed** verbs of motion, the category of **determinacy** that made unprefixated motion verbs so difficult no longer applies. There is no question of "going around / making round trips" or "being underway," etc. — only of choosing between **imperfective and perfective** aspect. In this regard, prefixed motion verbs are **no different** from any other ordinary Russian verbs that come in aspectual pairs!
