

## 1. Translating conditionals

Begin by translating a few **если** constructions (the bold only).

1. **Если погода будет хорошая**, мы пойдём в парк. \_\_\_\_\_
2. **Если ты купишь мне билет**, я пойду с тобой. \_\_\_\_\_
3. **Если ты потерял ручку**, я могу дать тебе другую. \_\_\_\_\_

## 2. Creating conditionals

Create "**conditional**" clauses with **если**. For the sake of practice, these English "if" clauses use the **future**, to mirror the Russian.

1. "If there will be sun," we'll go to the dacha. \_\_\_\_\_, мы поедem на дачу.
2. "If there will be rain," we'll stay home. \_\_\_\_\_, мы останемся дома.
3. "If I will have time," I'll help you. \_\_\_\_\_, я тебе помогу.
4. I'll be glad "if you will come to the party." Буду рад, \_\_\_\_\_.

Of course, if the "if" clause refers to the **present**, Russian and English will use present tense. Create more clauses with **если**.

1. If you love art, go to the Hermitage! \_\_\_\_\_, иди в Эрмитаж!
2. If they don't have pizza, I'll order pasta. \_\_\_\_\_, я закажу пасту.

## 3. Creating hypotheticals

Say that these people would do these things (**hypothetically speaking!**). Be sure to include **бы**!

1. мои друзья + поехать в Сибирь \_\_\_\_\_.
2. мы + купить новую квартиру \_\_\_\_\_.
3. мой сосед + подарить маме машину \_\_\_\_\_.
4. профессор + помочь новому студенту \_\_\_\_\_.
5. я (m.) + прочитать "Войну и мир" \_\_\_\_\_.
6. я (f.) + прочитать "Братьев Карамазовых" \_\_\_\_\_.
7. ты (m.) + прокатиться на мотоцикле? \_\_\_\_\_?
8. ты (f.) + бояться жить в лесу? \_\_\_\_\_?

## 4. Hypothetical conditions

Create a few simple **hypothetical** conditions. Remember: **both** clauses include a **бы**.

1. If we had money, we'd buy you a ticket to the concert.

2. She'd write a brilliant article (блестящая статья), if she had a pen.

3. If our team (команда) had won (выиграть), they would have been in first place (на первом месте).
